To properly advise you, your attorney must have **ALL** the facts.

I understand you may have questions about completing the forms, but please try to answer the questions as completely as possible. I will be able to answer any questions during our first meeting. In addition, at our first meeting please bring with you the following documents: Completed Bankruptcy Questionnaire, Completed Household Goods Inventory, Pay Stubs for last 6 months, Tax Returns for last three years and anything else you have in your possession that may be helpful in answering the questions in the forms. I look forward to meeting with you to discuss this matter.
